A letter from the King:

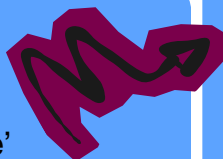

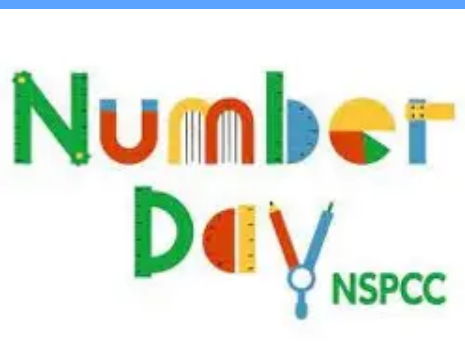


Water bottles should be plastic bottles only with the child's name.
