We have been looking at 'The Owl and the Star' in Literacy which shows us an owl's point of view of the excitement of following the Bethlehem star to Jesus' birth.



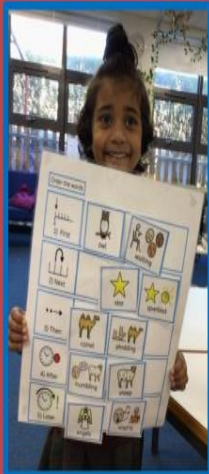

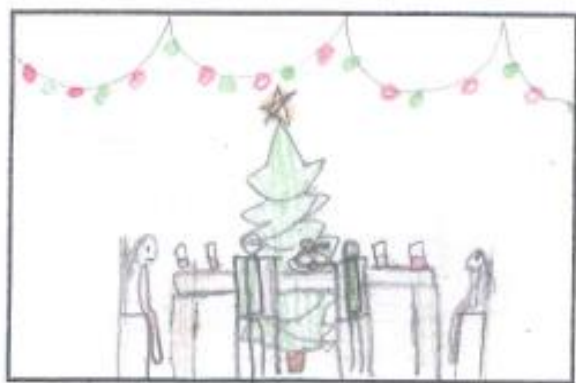


ALL THE BREAKING NEWS FROM THIS MONTH

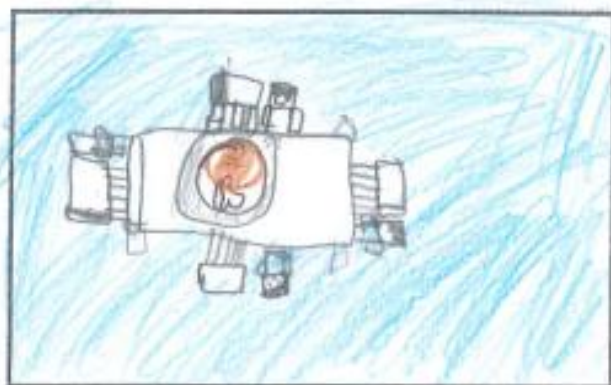
