The month of November started with All Saints day where we prayed for those gone before us and we are reminded we are all saints if we are following in Christ's footsteps.

### **Remembrance Day:**

Our Year 6 GIFT team led us in a beautiful remembrance service on the 11<sup>th</sup>. We respectfully held a minute's silence together in prayer. Each class presented a Poppy letter spelling out the words Lest we forget remembering those gone before us which was then displayed in the garden.

### **Anti-bullying week – Odd socks:**

We had fun wearing odd socks for the day to show our differences and how we are all unique. The theme of Anti-bullying week was 'power for good' and we focused on how we show respect and kindness to one another in many ways. Respect is also one of our school values so the children know the word very well and are excellent at showing respect to others, this is often commented on by visitors to the school about our children.

### **Hooks!**

Each half term the children begin a new theme in their curriculum. Your child's curriculum newsletter was shared with you which outlines the theme and how the subjects link together. To start each theme, we have a hook to engage and immerse the children into the theme. For example, Yr 6 experienced being evacuees and Yr 2 received a letter from King Charles himself! The hooks have been exciting ways to support the children's understanding, we look forward to the next ones in January.

### **Curriculum enrichment:**

As part of our new curriculum is the inclusion of class trips and experiences to enrich their knowledge and understanding. This month some Yr 6 had the opportunity to participate in the first Trust Football tournament and achieved 3<sup>rd</sup> place! Yr 2 went to Hainault Forest to look at habitats and go on a bug hunt, they also visited the farm animals too.

### **Jubilee celebration day:**

At the start of the year our Pope declared the Jubilee year as Pilgrims of Hope. St Aidan's wrote their pledges as what our hopes will be. Together we have learnt the song and prayer and focused throughout the year of how we can be pilgrims of hope for those in need. The jubilee celebration was a national day led by CAFOD to celebrate and come together united in prayer. We will be creating a tree of hope in the main hall to continue to grow our prayers of hope.



### **OPAL Award:**

As you know we had our final audit this month for OPAL (Outdoor play and learning) and we were delighted to achieve Gold award. St Aidan's provides an excellent and inclusive play opportunity for all children. We are now an exemplar school to others and will support other schools on their journey. 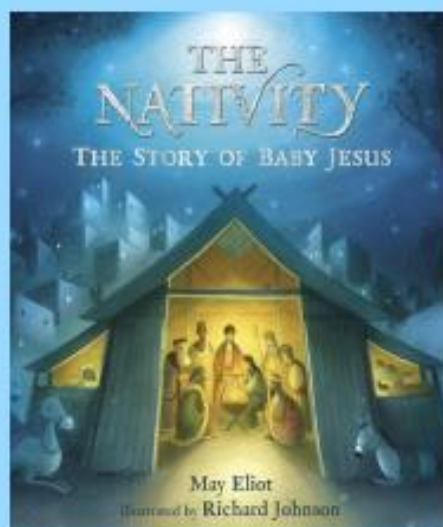

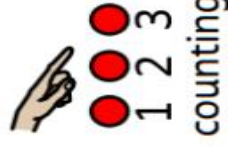

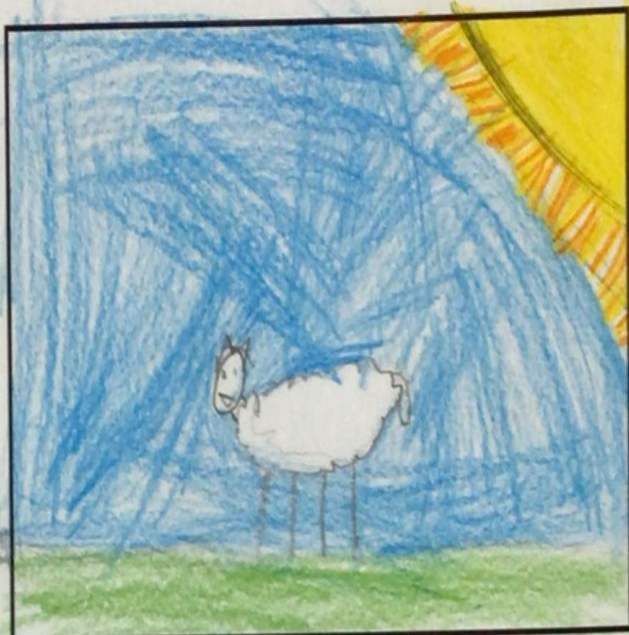

After Lunch we went to the farm. We saw ponies, goats but my favourite animal was the peacock. I had so much fun there.

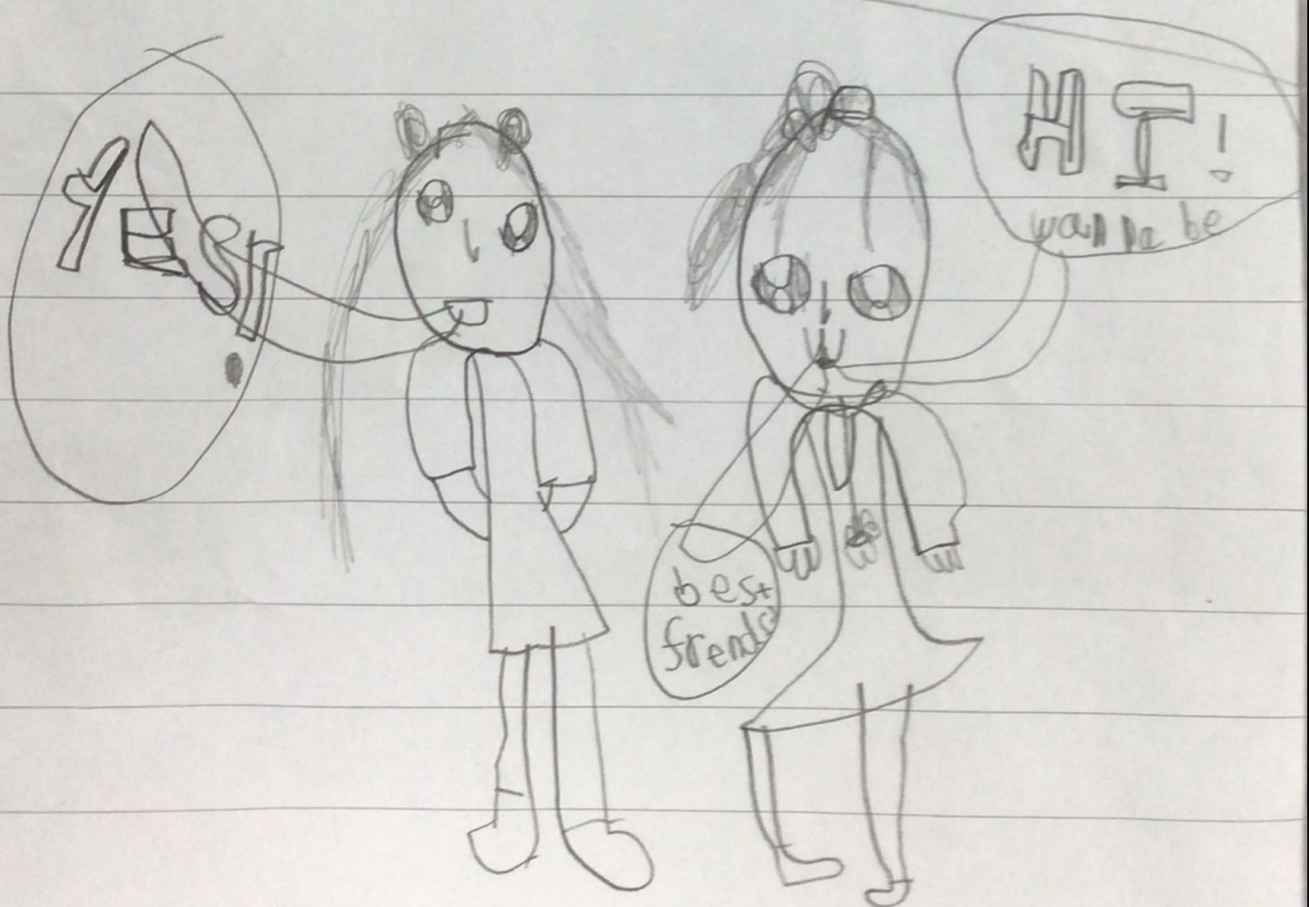

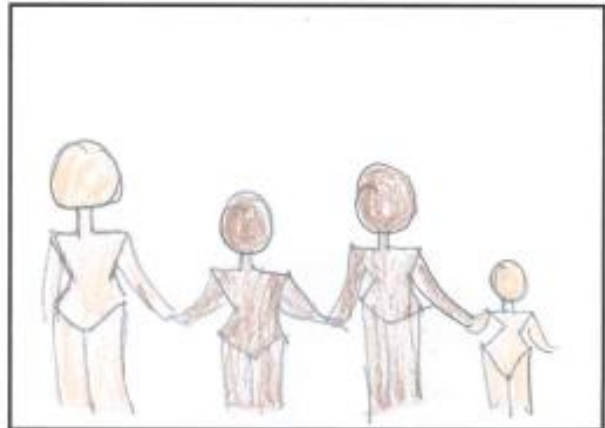
